HOW COURSES WORK

If you have any queries about the application procedure, please contact us: email sixthform@kennetschool.co.uk or call the Sixth Form Office on 01635 862121. Most Kennet Sixth Formers will take a two-year course which will lead to an A Level or T Level qualification. Students will need to study three A Level subjects or their equivalent (1 x T Level).

If students do not get their desired results, we also offer a one-year foundation programme which comprises a range of qualifications and skills all geared towards preparing learners for further study, employment or higher level apprenticeships. Students may take this course alongside resit courses in English and/or Mathematics GCSE.

^{*} We strongly encourage you to support this with the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which is equivalent to half an A Level.

Note: It is compulsory for Year 12 students to undertake one hour of enrichment activity per week.

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A LEVEL COURSES

To undertake courses at A Level, students will need a minimum of five GCSE subjects at Grade 4 or above (or equivalent), including English and Mathematics, together with a Grade 5 or above in the chosen subject. Some subjects may have additional criteria, detailed below:

Art, Craft & Design	Grade 5 in Art or Photography, or submission of a portfolio and successful interview prior to acceptance onto the course	
Biology	Grade 6 or above in GCSE Biology and one other science or Grade 66 in GCSE Combined Science. Grade 6 in GCSE English and Mathematics is desirable. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day	
Business Studies	Grade 6 or above in GCSE Business Studies	
Chemistry	Grade 6 or above in GCSE Chemistry and one other science or Grade 66 in GCSE Combined Science. Grade 6 in GCSE English and Mathematics is desirable. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day	
Classics	Grade 6 or above in GCSE English Language and/or GCSE English Literature	
Computer Science	Grade 5 or above in GCSE Mathematics and one of the GCSE Science qualifications. Programming experience to an equivalent level is required if GCSE Computer Science has not been taken. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day.	
Dance	Experience to an equivalent level is required if GCSE Dance has not been taken. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day	
Drama & Theatre Studies	Experience to an equivalent level is required if GCSE Drama has not been taken. Grade 5 or above in GCSE English is desirable. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day	
Economics	Grade 6 or above in GCSE Mathematics	
English Language	Grade 6 or above in GCSE English Language and/or GCSE English Literature	
English Literature	Grade 6 or above in GCSE English Literature and/or GCSE English Language

Photography	Grade 5 in Photography or Art, or submission of a portfolio and successful interview prior to acceptance onto the course	
Physical Education	Grade 5 or above in one of the GCSE Science qualifications and proficiency in at least in one sport	
Physics	Grade 6 or above in GCSE Physics and one other science or Grade 66 in GCSE Combined Science. Grade 6 in GCSE English and Mathematics is desirable. Students may be interviewed for a place on the course on GCSE results day

Extended Project Qualification

The Extended Project Qualification, known as an EPQ, is your chance to push yourself academically, gain UCAS points, and explore a topic that genuinely interests you. Worth half an A Level, it develops degree-level skills, such as research, planning and presentation, all highly valued by universities and employers. For those considering Law, a specialist EPQ pathway with taught content is available.

PREPARING FOR ADULT LIFE (PAL)

Our weekly PAL programme helps you navigate life beyond Sixth Form. Through talks and workshops from staff and guest speakers, you'll explore themes like health and wellbeing, politics, law, and personal finance, all designed to prepare you for independence.

THE SUPERCURRICULUM

Kennet Sixth Form students are encouraged to go beyond the classroom and embrace new opportunities. From peer mentoring to newspaper reading, the Super-curriculum is about curiosity, involvement, and expanding your horizons.

READ & STUDY PROGRAMME

With the Unifrog 'Read & Study' tool, you'll access articles, podcasts, films, TED Talks and book recommendations to deepen your subject knowledge and broaden your thinking.

GCSE RESIT COURSES

If you didn't achieve a Grade 4 in English and/or Maths at GCSE, you'll have the chance to resit. These core qualifications are essential for many employers and higher education routes, and we'll support you to achieve your best.

We'll help you build the independence, teamwork, and problem-solving skills needed for success at university and in the workplace. From effective research to confident presentations, these habits are embedded across Sixth Form life and reinforced in the PAL programme.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARS PROGRAMME

Our highest-attaining students receive personalised mentoring and support with early-entry applications, including Oxbridge, Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary pathways.

CAREERS

INFORMATION

At Kennet Sixth Form, our goal is simple: to prepare you for whatever comes next.

Every year, over 100 of our students apply to universities (including Oxbridge) to study a wide range of subjects. Some continue with areas they loved at school, such as English, Languages, Sport Science or Psychology, whilst others branch out into new fields like Anthropology, Law or Medicine. Many also progress into training with the NHS, or into specialist colleges for art, music, drama and dance.

But university is just one pathway. Our students also go on to:

- Employment
- Apprenticeships
- Sponsored degrees
- Gap years
- Internships
- School Leavers Programmes.

We'll help you explore all the options and find the right one for you.

Support is built into Sixth Form life through our Preparing for Adult Life (PAL) programme, one-to-one careers guidance, and visits from universities and employers. You'll also gain access to Unifrog, an online platform to research courses and apprenticeships, and to build CVs and personal statements.

Whether you're applying for UCAS, an apprenticeship, or a job, we'll help you with CVs, interviews, and personal statements. We also run mock interviews and sessions on "soft skills" (such as teamwork and communication) to ensure you stand out.

All students undertake work experience (in person or virtually), helping you develop key workplace skills and strengthen applications for competitive courses such as Medicine or Teaching.

At Kennet Sixth Form, you'll leave not only with excellent qualifications but also with the confidence, skills and guidance to take your next step.

PREPARING FOR UNIVERSITY

All university applications are made through UCAS, with A Level and vocational qualifications converted into UCAS points for universities for fair comparison.

From the start of Year 12, we encourage students to consider whether university is the right path for them. A degree can open doors to a wide range of careers and, on average, graduates still enjoy higher earning potential. But it's also a big decision.

That's why we provide structured guidance on course choices, university selection, gap year options, and financial planning. Students benefit from talks by university speakers, advice from experienced Sixth Form staff, and access to the latest careers resources in the Common Room and Sixth Form Library.

For competitive routes such as Medicine, Veterinary Science, Law, or Oxbridge, we offer a specialised preparation programme to support students with the application process. Our highest-attaining students also benefit from Kennet's Academic Scholars Programme, which provides personalised mentoring and targeted support with early-entry applications, including Oxbridge, Medicine, Dentistry, and Veterinary pathways.


As students move into Year 13, tailored guidance on UCAS applications and personal statements ensures every applicant can put forward the strongest possible case.
