General Bursary Criteria
<p>To qualify you must be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• either aged 16 to 18 on 31 August,• or be aged 19 or over while continuing a course you started aged 16 to 18 (known as being a '19+ continuer'),• or be aged 19 or over and have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). <p>You must also meet the residency criteria in ESFA funding regulations for post-16 provision.</p> <p>The bursary is paid to enable you to attend training with us and will only be paid if your attendance and behaviour meet the required standard.</p> <p>Any student meeting general eligibility requirements and facing financial hardship (due to exceptional reason/circumstances change) may apply on an individual basis by applying in writing.</p>

Discretionary Bursary Criteria

All applications must be accompanied by evidence of household income to allow individual evaluation of financial needs. This should be in the form of e.g. P60, Pay slips, etc.

Details provided:

You must also meet at least one of the following criteria and provide evidence. If you cannot provide evidence, then your application will not be processed.

- Universal Credit (provided an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)
- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance (Children who receive Income Based Job Seekers Allowance in their own right are also eligible).
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (from the National Asylum Support Service)
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working tax credit run on-paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If not aged 16 to 18 on 31 August, either:

- Evidence of being '19+ continuer'
- Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
