At Kennet School, we share that belief. We believe every pupil should start their journey with confidence and grow with purpose, discovering their strengths and ambitions along the way. We offer a high-quality learning environment built on a culture of care, collaboration, and trust - a place where curiosity is nurtured and every child is encouraged to achieve their potential.

As a top-performing, award-winning school, Kennet is a place where ambition and care go hand in hand. Our highly skilled teachers and associate staff work closely to deliver an exceptional education for every pupil, inspiring curiosity, supporting personal discovery, and encouraging growth in all areas of school life.

Our outcomes are among the best in the country but we believe education is about more than just strong academic results. It is also about helping each child uncover their strengths, explore new interests, and build the confidence to shape their future.

Our ambitious curriculum, alongside a rich co-curricular programme, gives pupils the chance to develop knowledge, creativity,

lifelong learning habits, self-belief, and a strong social conscience. The Kennet House system adds to this by creating a joyful sense of competition, a deep feeling of belonging, and the reassurance of clear, supportive boundaries.

The strength of our school has been recognised through a range of national awards, reflecting the commitment and shared purpose which define life at Kennet.

From the moment a new pupil arrives, we begin building a meaningful partnership with their family, rooted in trust and open communication. We work hard to ensure every child is both challenged and supported, and their individual talents are recognised and developed.

CONFIDENCE, CURIOSITY & COURAGE

Transitioning to secondary school is a significant step in a child's life, which can be both exciting and daunting.

At Kennet School, we aim to ensure our pupils start with confidence and grow with purpose. We focus on helping new pupils:

- Settle and embrace life at Kennet
- Engage academically through inspirational lessons
- Engage in co-curricular clubs and opportunities
- Adapt to new routines, taking responsibility for many aspects themselves
- Develop their character through personal development plans.

Before they join us, we visit pupils in their primary schools to get to know them. Our prime objective is to support each pupil to make the most of every opportunity, both inside and outside the classroom.

We work closely with local primary schools to ensure your child's new teachers have all the information they need to know about your child as an individual before they walk through our doors on their first day.

In addition:

- Your child will attend two induction days in the July before they join to experience life at Kennet and smooth away any transition concerns
- We offer a great opportunity for your child to get involved in a fun-packed, two-day summer school in August
- Your child will be invited to join our Rising Year 7 choir
- You will be invited to attend our Rising Year 7 parents' evening - an informative evening for you to meet with our Headteacher, Senior Leadership Team and Head of Year to discuss the transition process, curriculum and pastoral care, as well as the opportunity to ask as many questions as you like
- You are welcome to see the school in action by visiting the school during September open week and experiencing first-hand what Year 7 lessons entail
- You will meet your child's Head of House and tutor in October to discuss how they are settling in.

But that is just the start of the journey and our partnership.



MOTIVATING, INSPIRING & SUPPORTING

OUR HOUSE SYSTEM

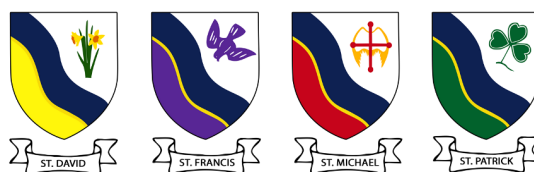
At the heart of our school community is our House system which helps every pupil build confidence, develop character and grow with purpose during their time at Kennet School. It aims to:

- Provide a sense of belonging within the school community
- Challenge pupils to achieve their full academic potential and reward them for their progress
- Support pupils by offering them the right level of care and guidance to be successful at school
- Ensure active engagement and participation in House events, competitions and co-curricular activities
- Create opportunities to develop social, intellectual, physical and practical skills
- Provide an awareness of individual and collective responsibilities
- Develop character through the six Kennet Values:



Linked to our values are the 'Kennet 5' pupil expectations, which detail what we expect each pupil to demonstrate, every day, eliminating any ambiguity and setting a clear framework to support and guide pupils to realise success.

We take the welfare of our pupils extremely seriously. We want our pupils to be safe, secure and successful.



All pupils are assigned to one of our four Houses – St David House, St Francis House, St Michael House, St Patrick House – in Year 7 where they remain until the end of the Sixth Form (younger siblings also join the same House). Even our staff are attached to a House.

The House system provides a robust mentoring programme within which older pupils become a strong support network for their younger counterparts. These relationships are priceless, providing friendship and support in which every pupil can feel safe and cared for. In Year 7, for example, pupils are assigned a 'link student', a friendly face they can go to for help and advice.

The Houses are in competition with each other to achieve the highest number of House Points at the end of each term and year. Pupils can contribute to their House Point totals in a number of ways, both in and out of the classroom. Regular House competitions keep spirits high, creating fierce competition, as well as a sense of pride. A considerable emphasis is also placed on community links and charity work, with each House choosing a charity close to them.

We believe in giving our pupils the opportunity to take responsibility for their own behaviour. Positive behaviour for learning and achievements is rewarded: from House Points to Commendations; badges to trophies. Where pupils fail to meet our high expectations, we combine sanctions and restorative practice to ensure pupils learn from mistakes and these are not repeated.

THE SCHOOL DAY

At its basic level, each school day is broken down as follows:

*Period 5 is used by pupils in Key Stages 4 & 5, depending on the courses they are studying. Some clubs may run longer than 4:45pm.

Note: A bell system indicates key moving times during the day.

ATTENDANCE

Excellent attendance at Kennet School is an essential part of raising attainment, increasing pupil progress and helping them to fulfil their potential. We keep track of attendance as well as punctuality and encourage 100% in both.

READING

We offer a text-rich curriculum, with reading at its heart. We understand the importance of reading and, to help pupils continually improve, we dedicate time to it each day, with reading ages communicated home throughout Key Stage 3. Pupils are required to have a reading book with them every day.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Wearing the correct Kennet School uniform is an important part of being a pupil at our school and is mandatory for all in Years 7 to 11, without exception. It gives our pupils a sense of belonging and teaches them to dress professionally whilst taking pride in their appearance. A full list of school uniform requirements can be found on our website. Branded items can be purchased via Skoolkit and non-branded items are available from most high street retailers. We also offer a second-hand uniform service.

SCHOOL MEALS

We aim to provide our pupils with healthy, appetising food that sustains them throughout their working day. Our school canteen is open three times a day and caters for a wide range of tastes. It provides healthy choices, such as free porridge every morning, as well as accommodating special dietary requirements. We use a cashless payment system which requires money to be loaded via MyChildAtSchool (MCAS) and links to your child's fingerprint at the till. Your child can, of course, also bring a packed lunch and can eat with their friends in their designated social area or on the school field (weather permitting).

HOMEWORK

All homework is set online and accessible to both parents and pupils via our website and an app personalised to each pupil/parent. Homework supports pupils to retrieve and recall core knowledge, as well as apply core knowledge. We use online platforms to support learning, so access to a laptop/computer at home is very helpful.

MOBILE PHONES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Mobile phones are not permitted for use during the school day. All pupils are required to store their phones securely in school-issued locking pouches, which remain locked for the duration of the day.

UNIQUE LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Our curriculum is rich and varied, designed to help pupils start their academic journey with confidence and grow with purpose as learners. Each department comprises a highly qualified, specialist team of teachers based in well-resourced subject areas. Outstanding practitioners use research to inform cutting edge teaching and learning practices, resulting in a first-class, personalised curriculum which leads pupils to academic success and engenders a love of learning.

KEY STAGE 3 (YEARS 7-9)

Year 7:

Pupils engage in a broad and balanced curriculum, including subjects such as English, Mathematics, Science, French, Geography, History, Art & Design, Computer Science, Music, Design & Technology, Drama, Ethics & Philosophy, Physical Education (PE), Dance, Food Preparation & Nutrition, and Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education. English and Mathematics are taught in sets based on primary school data and Kennet School's baseline assessments, which are regularly reviewed. All other subjects are taught in mixed-ability groups.

Year 8:

The curriculum structure remains consistent with Year 7, ensuring continuity and progression. Most lessons are taught in broad ability bands, with setting based on attainment and regularly reviewed after assessment points.

Year 9:

Pupils continue with a similar curriculum structure, maintaining breadth while beginning to focus on areas of interest. This year serves as a foundation for Key Stage 4, with pupils making informed choices about the subjects they wish to specialise in during Years 10 and 11.

KEY STAGE 4 (YEARS 10 & 11)

Pupils follow one of four learning pathways tailored to their needs and prior attainment. These pathways determine the number and combination of GCSE or equivalent qualifications pursued. All pupils study a core curriculum comprising English, Mathematics and Science, alongside selected option subjects. Depending on ability, dedication and motivation, pupils can study up to 11 subjects at GCSE/Level 2. Courses commence in Year 10, culminating in final examinations at the end of Year 11.

Revision & Examination:

Daily study sessions teach a range of revision strategies, supplemented by parents' evenings, external training, and bespoke online resources. Regular assessments, including mock examinations, are conducted to ensure pupils can confidently recall and apply their knowledge. Kennet collaborates with various examining boards, including AQA, OCR, Pearson Edexcel and Eduqas/WJEC.

Next Steps:

Comprehensive careers and pastoral programmes provide extensive advice and guidance, supporting pupils in making well-informed decisions about their future, whether pursuing apprenticeships or joining our excellent Sixth Form (rated Outstanding by Ofsted), which the vast majority of pupils do. *See also page 10.*

KEY STAGE 5 (YEARS 12 & 13 / SIXTH FORM)

A Levels

Our Sixth Form offers a wide-ranging curriculum, including A Levels, T Levels and vocational qualifications. Facilities include well-equipped classrooms, large study rooms, computer facilities (including a coding lab) and social area with a dedicated café. The Sixth Form experience bridges the gap between school life and study or employment. Students typically make exceptional progress during these two critical years.

By this stage, our pupils have developed the confidence, independence and sense of purpose that define a Kennet School education. They benefit from extensive monitoring, assessment and comprehensive support for university or apprenticeship applications. A programme of external speakers addresses wider social, political and cultural issues, whilst all Sixth Formers are encouraged to take on leadership roles, from School Council to House Captains to working with the local community and mentoring younger pupils.

Our enrichment programme is second to none and allows students to engage in activities as diverse as sports, cooking, drama, Sixth Form band and the Extended Project Qualification. Consequently, our students graduate with excellent examination results, enriched character and the confidence to lead.

T Levels

We are proud to be the first Sixth Form in the local area to offer T Level qualifications. Designed with employers and businesses, T Levels provide learners a head start towards their chosen career and address workspace skills gaps through industry engagement and development.

We offer T Level qualifications in Business Management & Administration, Education & Early Years, Health and Media. In May 2024, we opened a new, state-of-the-art T Level Hub, designed to support practical learning across all pathways. The facility includes hospital beds, a fully equipped media studio, office-style spaces, and a flexible workspace with break-out areas. This facility offers students and staff an exceptional learning environment.

EXAMINATION RESULTS

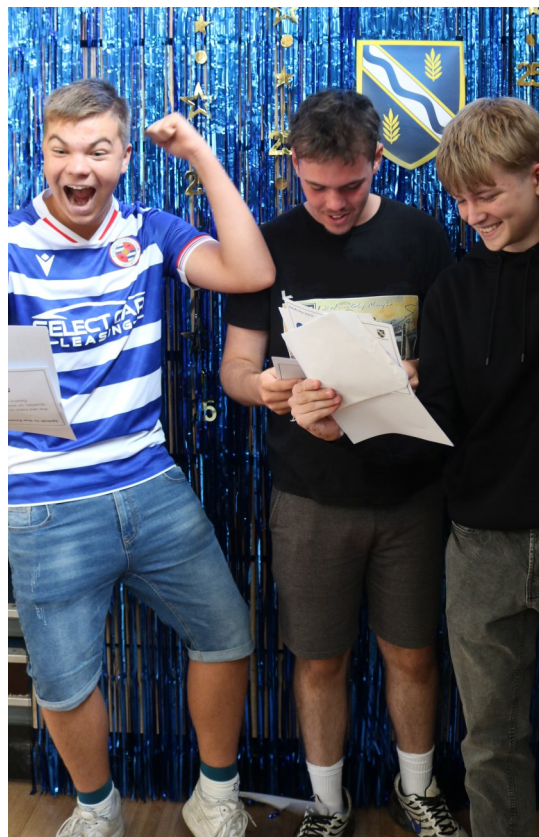
Results across the vast majority of curriculum areas, including English, Maths and Science, far exceed the national averages at GCSE, and in 2024 an impressive 23% of all grades were awarded at grades 9-7.

In addition, results at A Level put Kennet School students consistently in the top quarter of all schools for progress, and we are proud of the excellence demonstrated here too with 25% of all grades achieved awarded at an A or A*.

These excellent results demonstrate the hard work, tenacity, and effective learning habits instilled in our pupils.

BUILDING CHARACTER

Opening doors is not simply about having the right grades, but the confidence, character and purpose to succeed. This is why Kennet places such emphasis on joining in and participation via our pupil participation programmes, our co-curricular offer and our enrichment programme.





NEXT STEPS

Following the Government's Gatsby Benchmarks, we aim to inspire pupils via a programme of opportunities which contains information about what lies beyond school life. These include:

- Work-related learning events involving local businesses both on and off site
- A monthly outside speaker programme, often by past pupils, parents or members of the local community
- Personalised Unifrog accounts for every pupil
- Interview days
- Access to the Careers Corner in the library
- Access to numerous careers websites
- Visits to and from local universities
- Support for apprenticeship applications from Level 2 to sponsored degree pathways
- Psychometric testing, with personalised support and development
- Education Business Partnership workshops for targeted groups
- Extra help through their tutor as required
- Year group-focused careers fairs, both on and off site
- Targeted, bespoke interventions for disadvantaged pupils
- Industry-specific webinars.



EVERY PUPIL KNOWN

Each pupil at Kennet School is recognised as an individual. Supporting pupils to achieve their potential means recognising and nurturing their distinct talents, helping every pupil develop the confidence to pursue their ambitions.

Every pupil is supported by a strong pastoral framework and individual mentoring by tutors, pastoral leaders and the senior leadership team. This personal approach is the bedrock of Kennet and ensures our pupils enjoy ongoing guidance to develop their aspirations to the full.

In the classroom, we have a robust monitoring of pupil understanding, providing regular feedback on progress and placing dialogue between pupil and teacher at its heart. This is supported by a range of intervention programmes to ensure all our pupils, whatever their ability or learning need, are able to flourish and thrive. Lessons are tilted to meet the needs of each and every pupil.

There is a strong sense of belonging here at Kennet School and it is the pupils themselves who create the unique Kennet atmosphere that is so conducive to learning. This is underpinned by our values - respect, integrity and kindness.



SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

We recognise individuality and utilise a whole range of support to remove barriers to learning and celebrate every success with pupils. As a truly inclusive school, every pupil's education is equally important and we recognise that support required may take different forms, whether they have a medical condition, learning difficulties or just need to work through some issues, there is always someone on hand to help.

HEARING RESOURCE BASE/ PHYSICALLY DISABLED RESOURCE

We are also justifiably proud of both our Hearing Resource Base and Physically Disabled Resource. Not only are we well-equipped with specialist equipment, teachers and teaching assistants, but our pupils thrive academically and socially due to the outstanding support and encouragement provided by the whole school community.

MORE ABLE, GIFTED & TALENTED

The Kennet Scholars Programme is a tailored programme for high-achieving and ambitious pupils, providing specialist academic enrichment, mentoring, and guidance. It is designed to develop the knowledge, skills and mindset required for success at the most competitive universities and careers.

This dynamic and stimulating programme goes beyond standard classroom learning. The Kennet Scholars Programme is open to all pupils who demonstrate:

- A passion for learning and intellectual curiosity
- High academic achievement
- Ambition to apply for competitive university courses.

While it is important for us to offer a range of co-curricular activities, we prioritise quality teaching first for all our pupils in the classroom.

DEVELOPING PASSION & ENRICHING LIVES

We provide an unrivalled programme of co-curricular activities which allow pupils to explore new interests, build confidence and develop a strong sense of purpose, with over 200 day trips, exchanges and tours provided each year, all giving our pupils the chance to stretch themselves, gain insights beyond the classroom, learn new skills and even compete at an international level.

Our budding artists experience an array of opportunities to develop their skills, creativity and abilities further, including acting, choreography, photography, textiles, cookery, woodwork, set design and production.

Our musicians enjoy a wide range of ensembles including orchestras, choirs, jazz and soul bands, which provide opportunities for both beginners and experts alike. We also put on many concerts throughout the academic year, not to mention tours.

Our keen sportsmen and women benefit from some of the finest sporting facilities in the county, from extensive playing fields, floodlit tennis and netball courts, outdoor and indoor cricket nets, a weights gym, a huge sports hall, an indoor heated swimming pool and a host of other facilities, including a purpose-built dance studio.

Our promising actors thrive in various avenues such as school productions, House Performing Arts and co-curricular clubs.

Sixth Formers can enhance their understanding of performance through the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts (LAMDA) qualification.

Enrichment trip opportunities also feature highly with language trips abroad, art trips to galleries, theatre trips in Drama and English, field trips in Geography and music tours to name but a few.

Internationally, past opportunities have included trips and tours to France, Germany, Italy, Malta, Austria, Spain and Switzerland, as well as expeditions to Borneo, Ecuador, Mongolia, Peru and Kenya. An exchange to Korea is our latest exciting international experience for pupils.

Regular expeditions, camping (Year 7s), climbing lessons, ski trips and sports tours, all provide further opportunities for pupils to develop their confidence and self-awareness.

Kennet School believes in the value of outdoor pursuits and is a highly successful registered provider of the Duke of Edinburgh's (DofE) Award Programme, as well as the Combined Cadet Force (CCF), run in partnership with Bradfield College, and the British Young Pilots (BYP) Club.

COMMUNICATION IS KEY

Education is very much a partnership between our pupils, their parents/carers and our staff. Co-operation and communication is crucial for all our pupils' development, so we endeavour to keep you fully informed through a number of communication channels:

Phone/Email: We are always pleased to see you to discuss your child's progress. We try to respond as quickly as possible but the majority of staff will be teaching during the school day, so please bear with us. Your child's tutor, subject teacher, Head of House or Head of Year are the people who will have the greatest knowledge of your child. We aim to respond to all enquiries within 48 hours.

Website: There is a wealth of information on our website from term dates to events to job opportunities.

Mobile App: Kennet uses one mobile app: My Child at School (MCAS). It's used for keeping an eye on your child's homework tasks, monitoring your child's achievements, accolades and behaviour, paying for trips and school meals, as well as reporting absences.

Social Media: Keep up-to-date with our activities and achievements via our Facebook or Instagram accounts. Ex-pupils are also encouraged to connect with us on LinkedIn.

Letters: Letters are emailed regularly, depending on what is relevant to you and your child. All communication is also available on the MCAS app.

Newsletters: We publish newsletters every half term, containing information on recent activities and achievements.

Parents' Evenings: You will be invited to an evening where you can meet teachers to discuss your child's progress.

Reports: Issued twice a year to ensure you are kept up-to-date with how well your child is progressing through the curriculum and allowing pupils to reflect on their learning habits.

PARENT/TEACHERS ASSOCIATION COMMUNITY (PTAC)

You will automatically become a member of our PTAC when your child joins Kennet, a voluntary body which supports the school (both socially and financially) through fundraising activities. Whether you support the PTAC as a committee member, a helper or simply just turn out to the events, you are helping to provide our school with valuable resources to give all pupils, your children, the best education possible.
